"The Heart"




GENDER EXPRESSION

• How you look and act!


(external presentation)

GENDER

•Gender is <u>NOT</u> a BINARY either / or thing

KEY DEFINITIONS

CIS Gendered

```
("CIS" ... The same as...)
The plumbing and the brain match.
```

Transgendered

The plumbing <u>does NOT</u> match the brain.

TRANSGENDERISM

- It is <u>NOT</u> a Choice
- It is <u>NOT</u> a Lifestyle

•It is a deep fundamental core aspect of our <u>personhood</u>

LABELS

Lets make it simple.... The only label that truly matters.... My Name That is my label.... That is the label that matters to me... THAT Name is my identity.... Please call me by my name...

DEPRESSION

- For <u>Male to Female</u> trans people the depression rate is 61%.
- For <u>Female to Male</u> trans people the depression rate is 66%.
- The <u>suicide rate</u> for Trans persons in Ontario

is 43%


DEPRESSION

TOBY'S ACT- JUNE 2012 BILL C-33

- Toby's Act was named in honour of Toby Dancer, a music producer and transsexual.
- The Bill amends the
 Ontario Human Rights Code
 to include Gender Identity
 and Gender Expression



TOBY'S ACT-JUNE 2012

THE RIGHT TO BE FREE FROM DISCRIMINATION AND HARASSMENT BECAUSE OF GENDER IDENTITY OR GENDER EXPRESSION

TOBY'S ACT- 2012

Empowers all of us to do THE RIGHT THING with confidence

TOBY'S ACT- 2012

The RIGHT to be treated

"THE SAME AS"

anyone else of the gender we identify with

ACCOMMODATION

Accommodation means that the person is to be included and treated just like any other person of the gender they identify with.

Involuntary segregation of the person to provide the service **DOES NOT** meet the standard of accommodation.

BATHROOMS AND GENDER SPECIFIC FACILITIES

- A trans-person has the RIGHT to use the gender specific facility of the gender they identify with.
- Bathrooms are a BARRIER to trans persons (our most feared place)
- Please do what you can to make this a safe place for trans persons.

TRANS SENIORS A NEW CHALLENGE WE ARE COMING..... WE ARE HERE





• The right to our preferred name and pronouns regardless of what our legal identification indicates.

 The right to express gender in the way we choose.

The right to accommodation and gender specific facilities based on the gender we identify with.


Note: Segregation is **NOT** to be used as a method of accommodation.

- The right to self determination.
-a Power of Attorney (POA)
 DOES NOT GIVE Absolute Power to the agents.....
- The person has the <u>RIGHT</u> to make any decision the person is capable of making that does not negatively impact their health or safety.

SENIOR TRANS PERSONS

- Most senior trans persons have carefully hidden for all of their lives.
- They are typically not OUT They are usually in the CLOSET and do not want to be discovered.
- Those that are OUT
 often face serious family challenges.

BEING OUT VS THE CLOSET



CONFIDENTIALITY

- Confidentiality is so IMPORTANT!
- DO NOT DISCLOSE our status to anyone unless you have obtained our permission.
- Beware of <u>INADVERTENT</u> disclosure
- EVERY trans person has a <u>RIGHT</u> to confidentiality
- You have an <u>OBLIGATION</u> to protect our privacy.
- Breaching confidentiality can have catastrophic consequences

TRANS PERSONS AT HOME

- The person may not want to tell you because of fear of rejection.
- There may be telltale signs such as clothing of the other gender where it doesn't seem like it belongs.
- The person may be wearing underwear that is not consistent with the outerwear.
- The person may wish to dress in a way that family does not agree with.

DEMENTIA

- We will waffle and there will be confusion and doubts as our mental condition changes.
- There is still <u>the need to accommodate</u> in a reasonable manner.
- This is going to be a most difficult challenge.

PLEASE...

Provide as much accommodation as possible in a compassionate manner.

POLICES AND PROCEDURES

- Please get ready NOW
- The Ontario Human Rights Code is the foundation.
 EMPOWERMENT for the person and for you.
- Education combined with understanding is vital.
- PLEASE be ready to safeguard our Human Dignity.

WHAT ARE YOU GOING TO DO?

- Where are you going to put us?
- How are we going to be addressed?
- How are we going to be treated?
- What happens when our wishes conflict with what family wishes?
- •What happens when dementia sets in?
- How are you going to ACCOMODATE us?
