- Evidence-based interventions in caregiver support
- consider in case management
- Being evaluated by service in a variety of settings and locations

- Issues in Case Management (CG-care recipient; CG-service provider; systemic tensions & service providers; transitions, crises & difficult conversations; difficult emotions an caregiving; inclusion and diversity; legal & ethical issues; stress & self-care).

Caregiver Policy Lens

- Analytical framework to assess planned and current programs and policies from the perspective of caregivers
- Can identify any unintended negative effects of policies and programs on caregivers
- Provides a common framework for both the development and critique of program and policies
- Process and outcome tool; advocacy tool
- Informed by literature and key informant interviews
- Being field tested at 8 sites in 3 regions of Canada
- Being evaluated by diverse planners & policy makers
